HEALTH PRIORITY: COVID-19 Pandemic

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH NEED DATA:

- On March 9, 2020, Governor JB Pritzker declared all counties in the State of Illinois as a disaster area in response to the outbreak of COVID-19.
- As of April 13, 2020, there are 22,025 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Illinois and 794 deaths.

- As of April 13, 2020, there are 421 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Kane County and 24 deaths.
